Through a grant from the Champlain Valley National Heritage Partnership, and with the help of other partners, the MRBA was able to design and fund improvements at two river-front properties owned by the Village of North Troy and by the Troy School. A Vermont Youth Conservation Corps crew built and installed benches along the path leading to the river behind the Legion ballfield in North Troy, and built bridge structures to protect the riparian ecosystem at the school's Middleton Property on River Road.

Ranier Lucas




Ranier is serving as the MRBA Assistant Coordinator of 2019-2020 as a part of the ECO Americorps program with the VT Department of Environmental Conservation.

Originally from Binghamton, New York, Rainer grew up living at the confluence of the Susquehanna and Chenango Rivers, causing him to develop a strong passion for the environment and water quality.

Ranier began his college education at Broome Community College, pursuing an environmental degree. During this time he was able to take two travel Ecology courses: one in the Everglades and the other out west to learn in and about five National Parks. After spending three weeks in the Grand Tetons and Zion National Park, he decided to continue his education at the University of Buffalo, graduating with a degree in Environmental Geoscience in 2018.







During 2019, the MRBA was able to work with partners and volunteers to plant nearly 2000 trees at three locations in the watershed, and to install structures (bridges and benches) at two locations along the Missisquoi, improving the experience of visitors while also protecting the ecosystem. We collected water samples at 24 sites, adding to the water quality information we've been gathering for over 15 years! The funding we receive from our donors helps implement projects like these, covering vital costs that are outside of grant funds; thanks for your support!

Tree Plantings

In 2019 the MRBA planted over 2,000 trees in the watershed, with support from the Vermont DEC and the Lake Champlain Basin Program, and our fantastic volunteers:

- 600 in North Troy and
- 925 in Troy with help from the VYCC
- 75 in Enosburg
- 455 in Montgomery with student help

Education and Outreach Programs

Lake Lessons:

The MRBA once again offered a station at the collaborative educational experience Lake Lessons - teaching over 500 new 4thand 8th-grade watershed stewards about runoff and land-use impacts.

Dairy in the Classroom:

MRBA staff presented our rainfall simulator at three field trips for the Dairy in the Classroom program, adding a connection between land-use and water quality to students during their farm visit.

Bugworks

The MRBA has been offering free sessions of our aquatic insect investigation -Bugworks - to watershed schools since 2008. In 2019, we reached 14 audiences.

In 2019, MRBA was able to provide **14**Bugworks sessions to over **150** students; **4** watershed sessions to over **60**students; and demonstrate our rainfall simulator to educate over **500** students about runoff and infiltration.

In 2019 the MRBA collected hundreds of water samples from **24** sites through the La Rosa Program with the Vermont DEC. This was our **16th** year with this program, and we sampled these sites for phosphorous and nitrogen to monitor water quality within our watershed.


